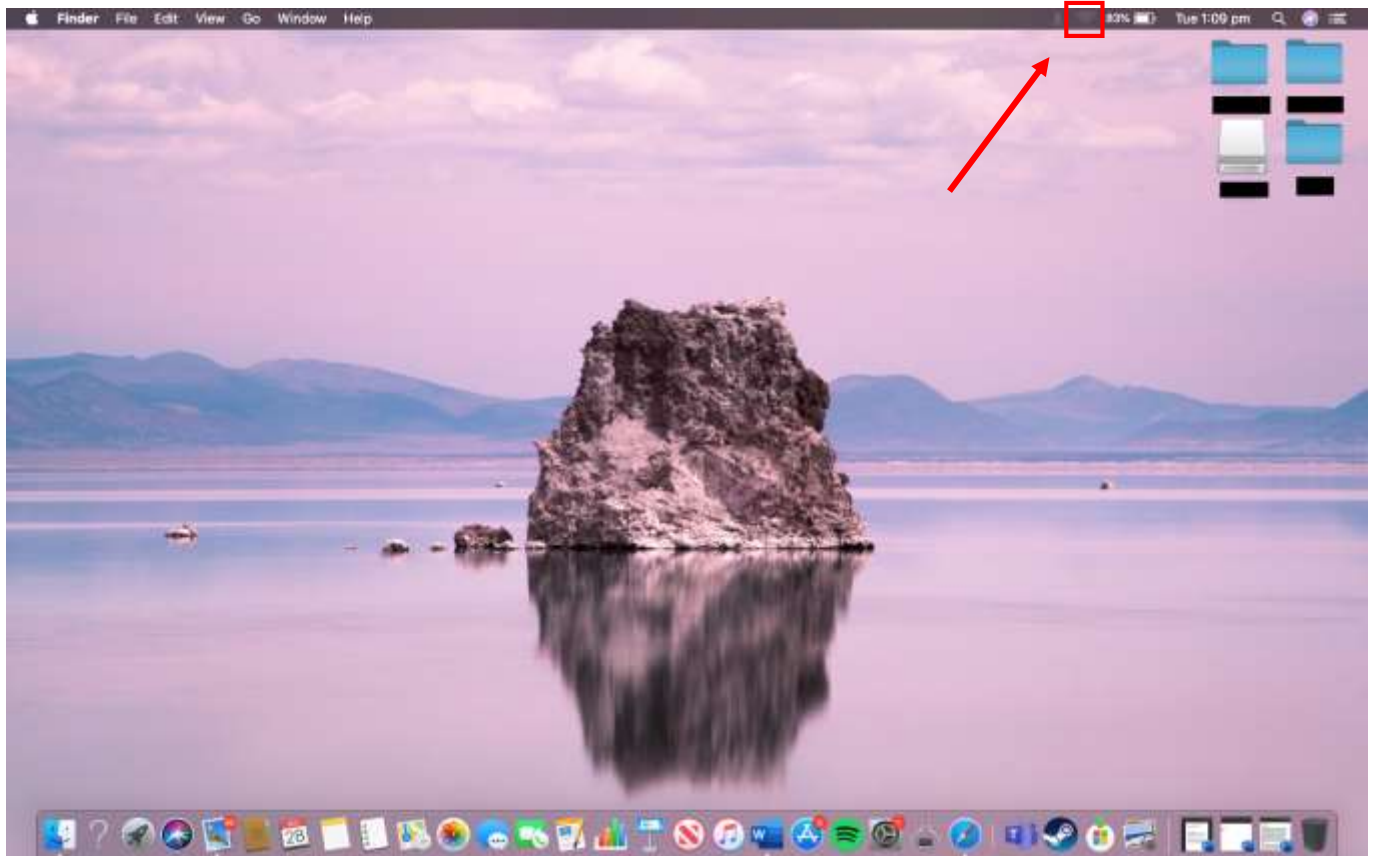


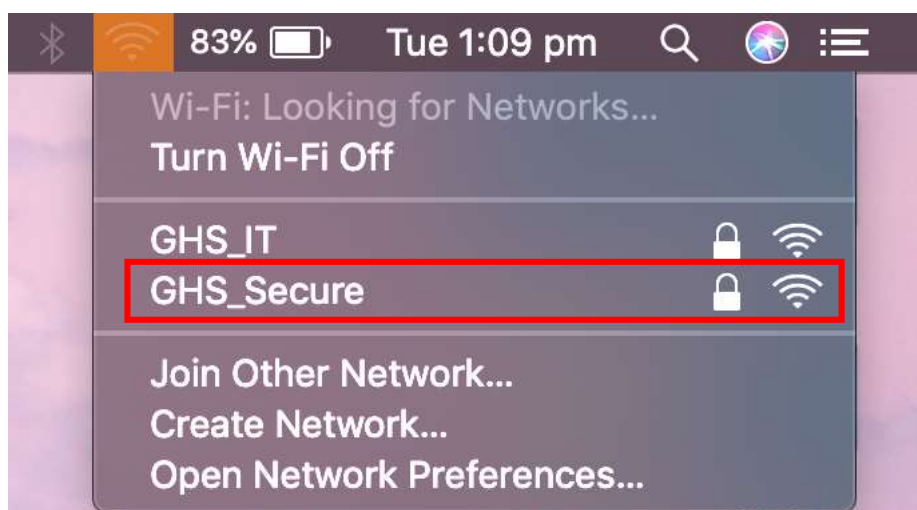


Connecting BYOD to WiFi (MAC OS)

- Open WiFi symbol at the top right of your screen



- Select Network "GHS_Secure"

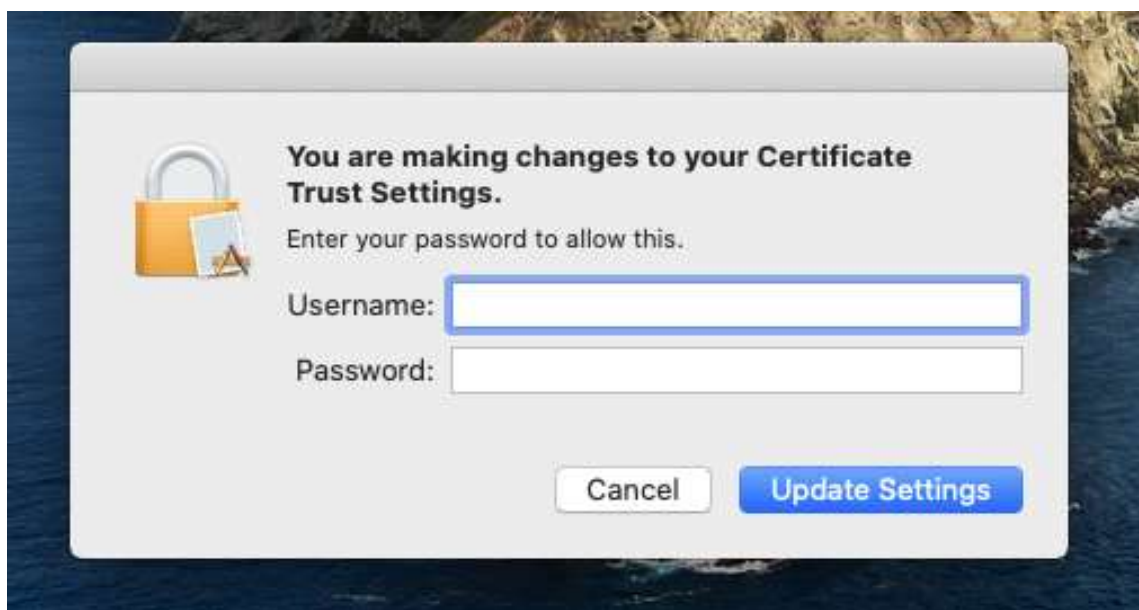
GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- Input School computer login information, for example:
 - o ghs\firstname.lastname
 - o *Password*
- Tick the box "Remember this network"
- Then Click "Join"
- A new popup will open asking to "Verify Certificate", click continue



- Now it will ask for your personal login and password for the apple device, input your password that you use to unlock the machine in order to make changes and allow network access.



GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- To connect to network drives like the “Public Drive” and your personal student drive, simply click on the desktop so that “Finder” is displayed at the top left of the screen



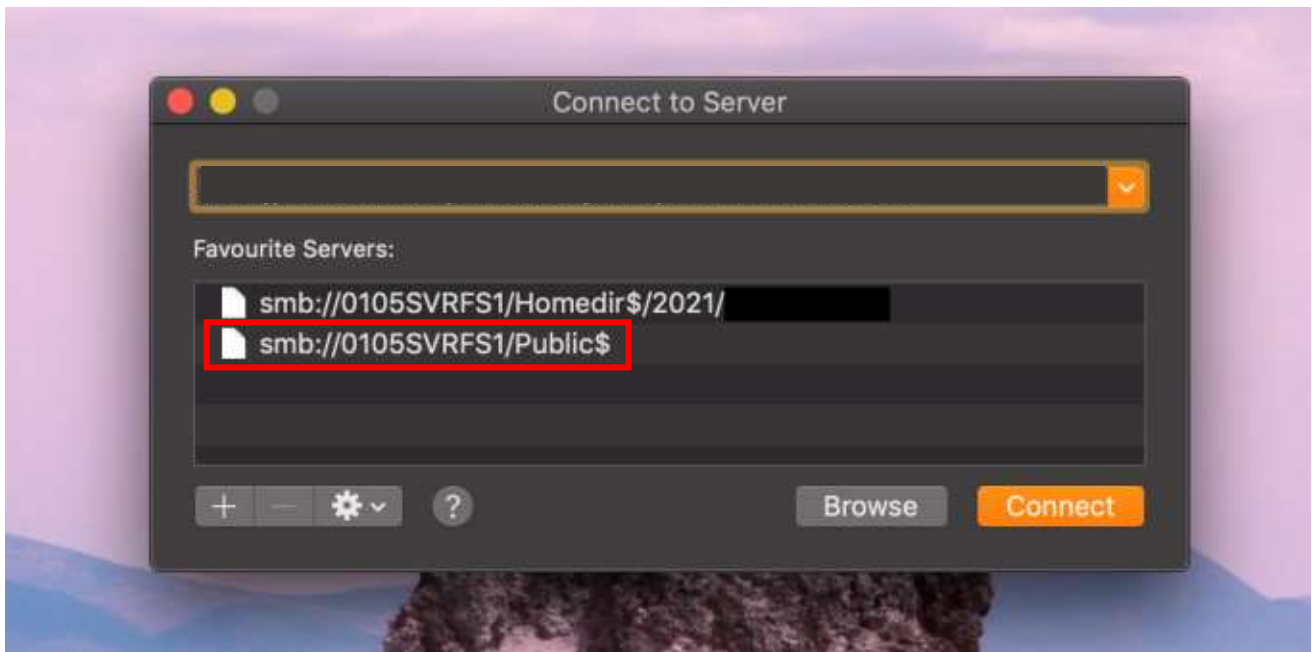
- Once “Finder” is showing, click on “Go” in the top bar and then “Connect to server...”



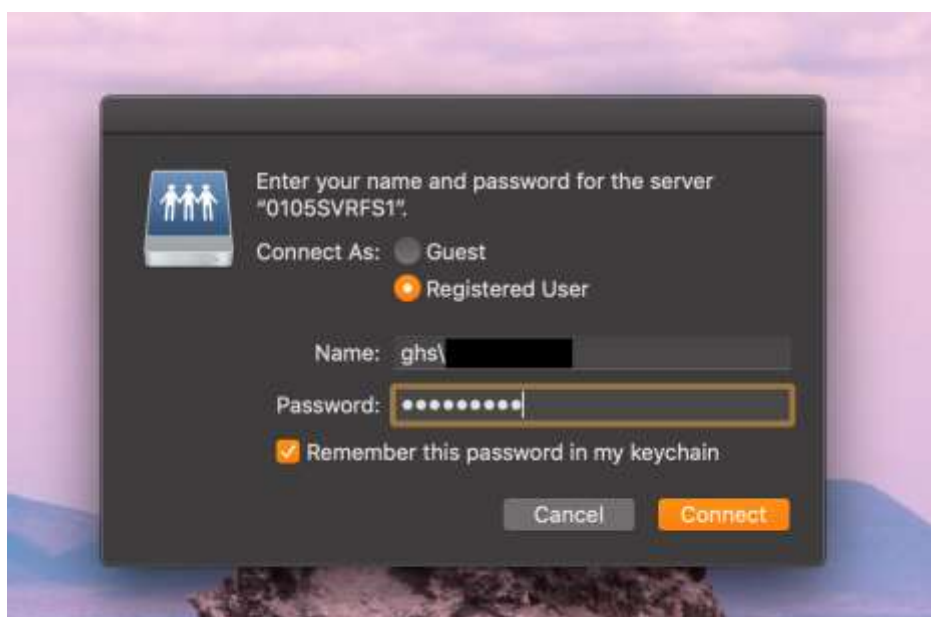
GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- A new window will open and here you can input the server address
 - o Public Drive:
 - `smb://0105SVRFS1/Public$`



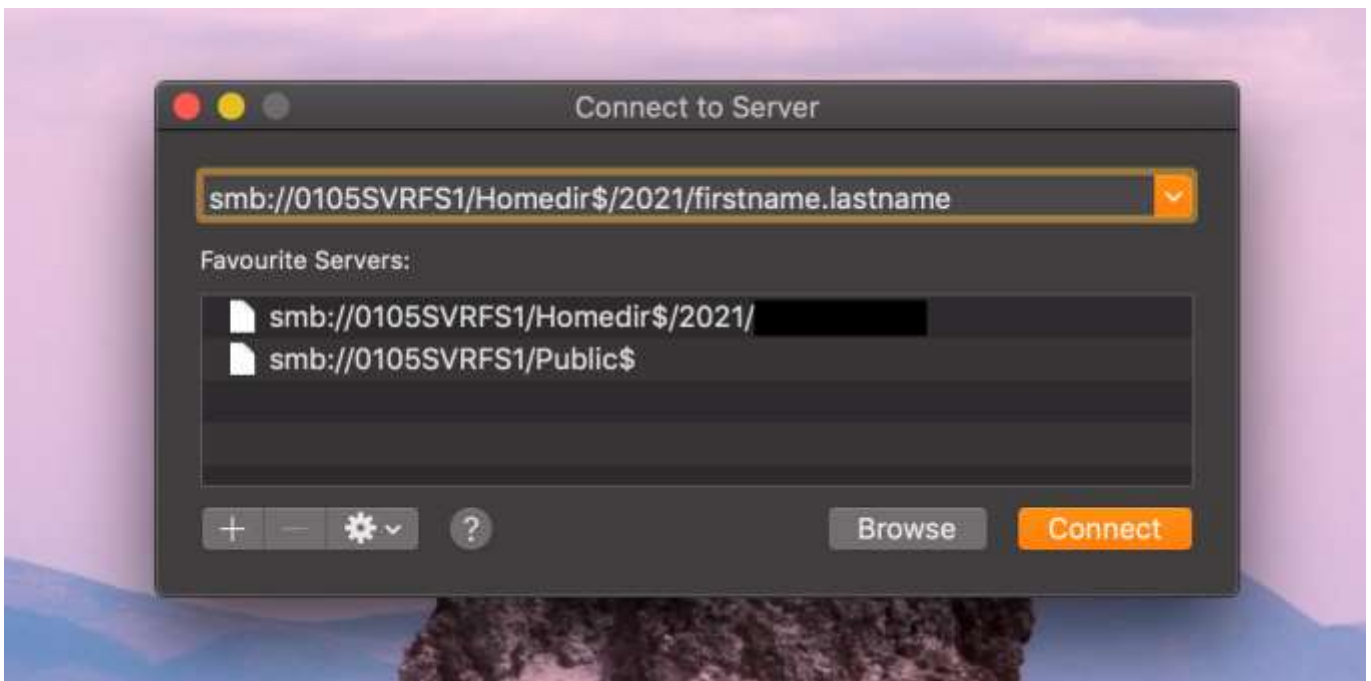
- Down the bottom of this window is a little Plus and Minus, click the Plus button to save the address for future use.
- Once the address is input and saved, click “Connect” then “Continue” on the next popup
- Now, in this screen you will need to input your school network login again that you used for the WiFi, leave “Registered User” selected, for example
 - o `ghs\firstname.lastname`
 - o `*Password*`



GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- Make sure to tick the “Remember this password in my keychain” box before connecting
- Once connected, immediately close this window and open back into the “Connect to server...” window
- Now we want to input the address for your personal student drive, this time however, in the address bar, you will need to put one of two things.
 - o If you are a year 12 this year then input “\\0105SVRFS1\Homedir\$\Firstname.Lastname” substitute your name
 - o If you are year 8, 9, 10 or 11, then input “\\0105SVRFS1\Homedir\$\2020\Firstname.Lastname” replacing the year with the year you will graduate, as well as the name. For example year 9’s will graduate 2023

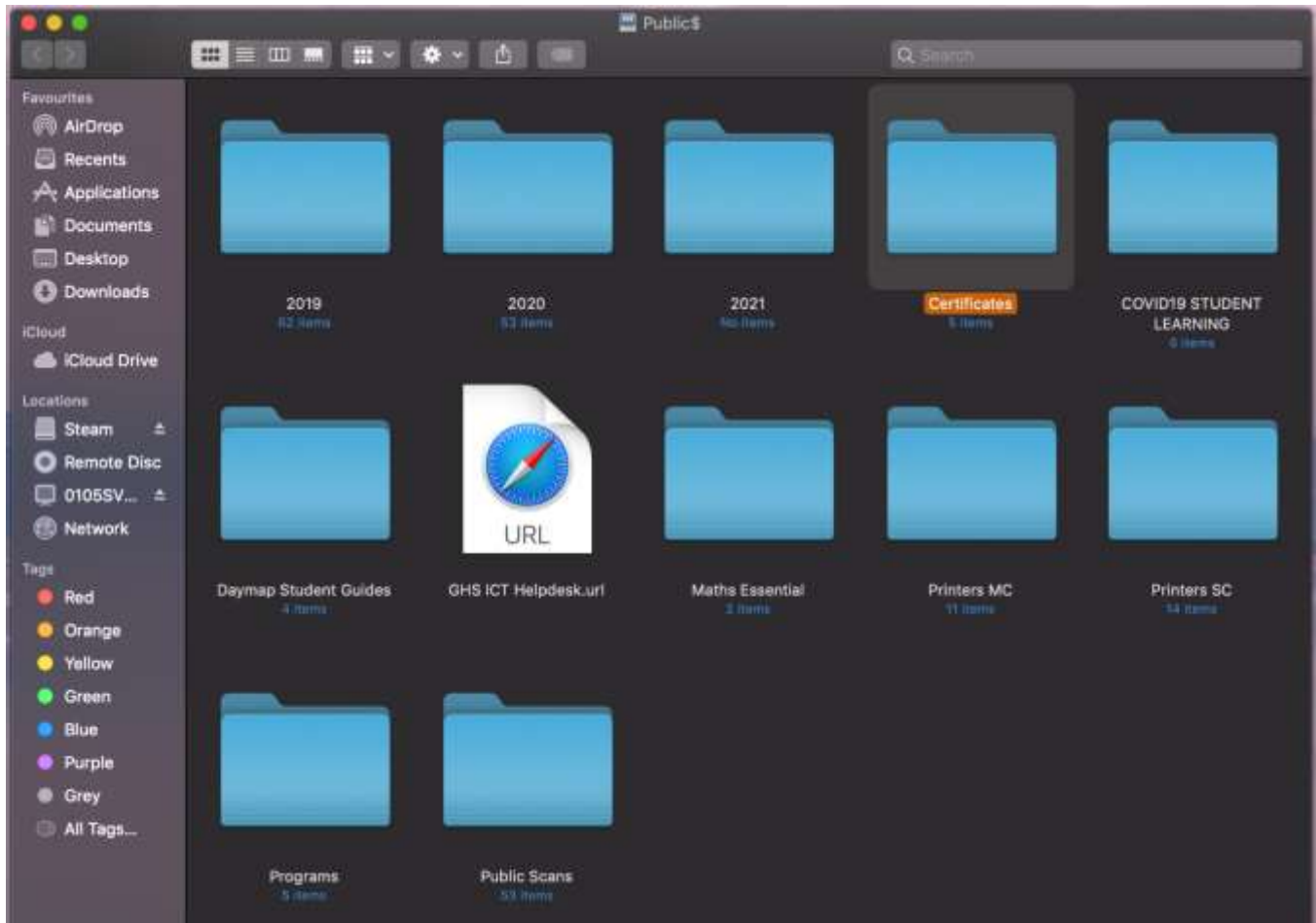


- You don’t need to connect to this drive now, just simply click the Plus button to add it to your favourite locations for future use

GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- Now we want to get access to the internet. To do so, open the public drive that we connected to previously and open the “Certificates” folder

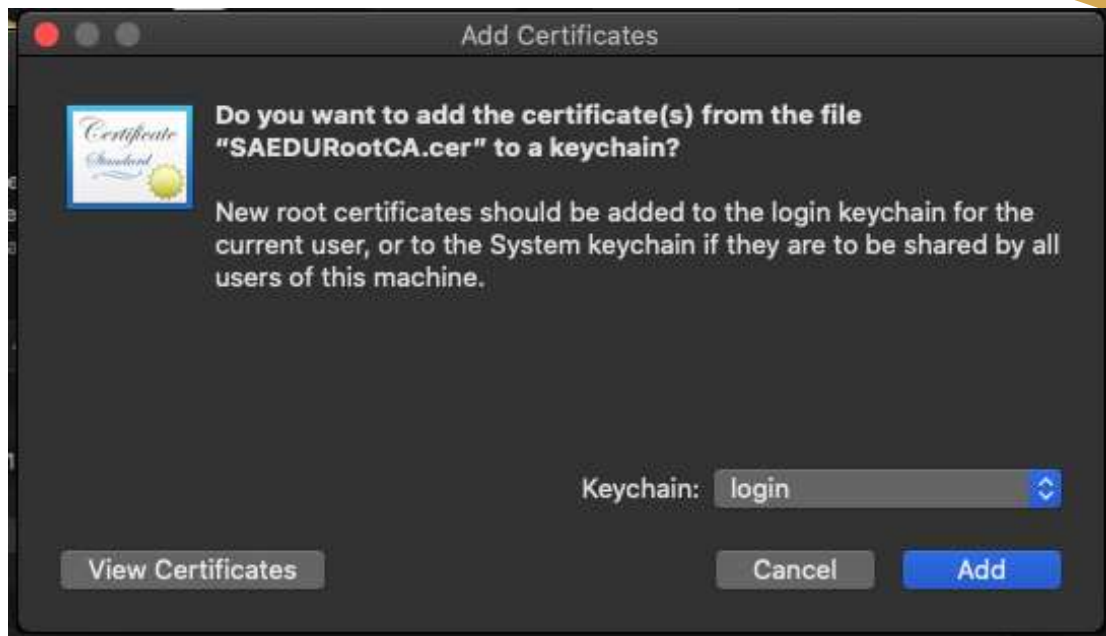


- From here, double click on all the files except the “Install Certificates” file (that file is for windows machines)
- This will open up 2 windows, the keychain access window and also an “Add Certificates” window, just click around them and open all the files required.

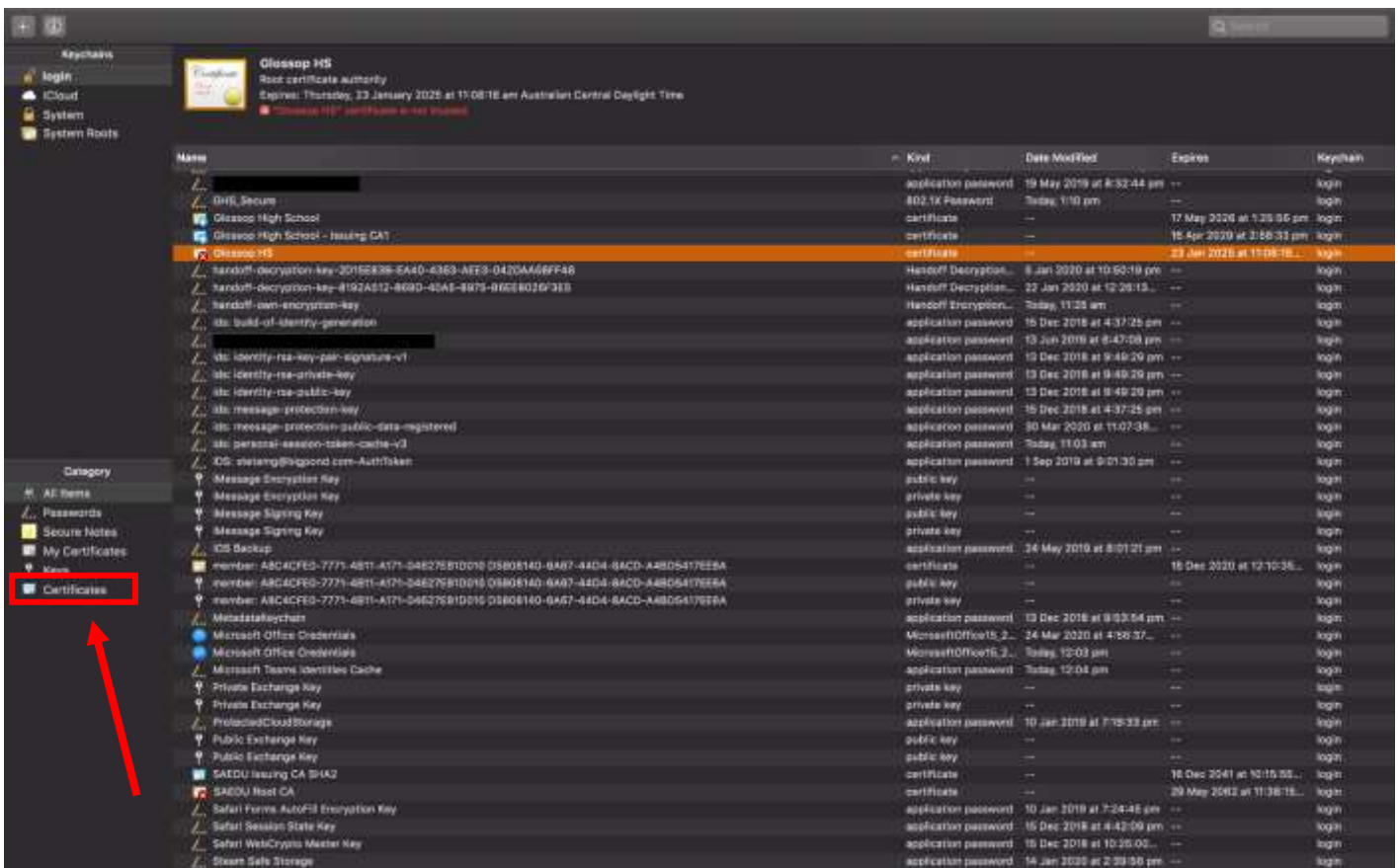

- Once you have opened all the certificates you can click the “Add” button on all the “Add certificates” windows



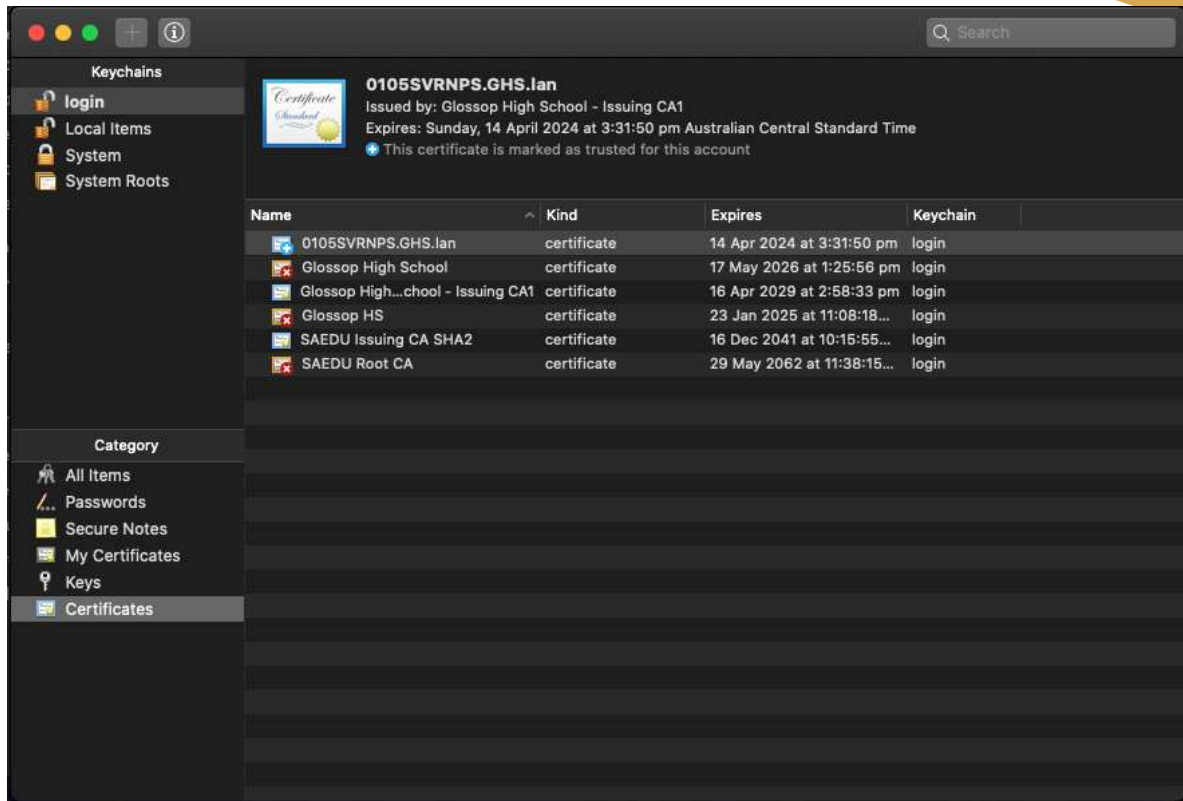
- Down the bottom left under category you can select the “Certificates” tab, this will show you all the certificates installed on your mac but most importantly, the Glossop high school certificates used to access the internet



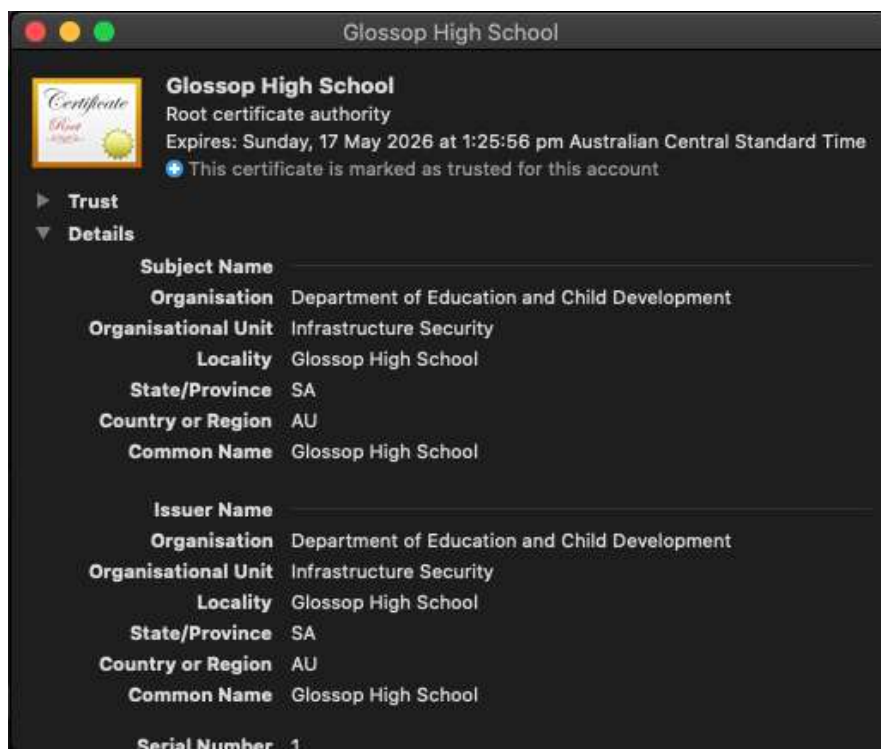
GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- After selecting the “Certificates” tab, you will be greeted by a smaller list of items



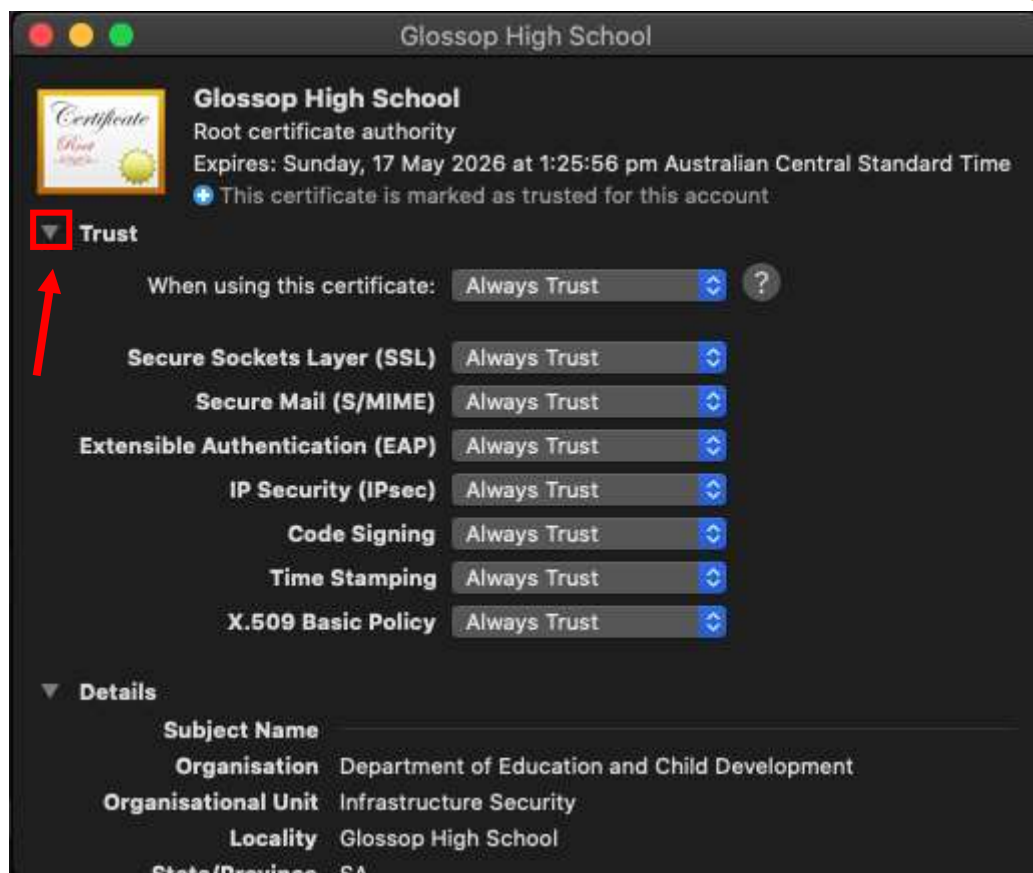
- Each of the Glossop HS certificates will need to have a setting changed. To do so, double click to open up information about a given certificate.



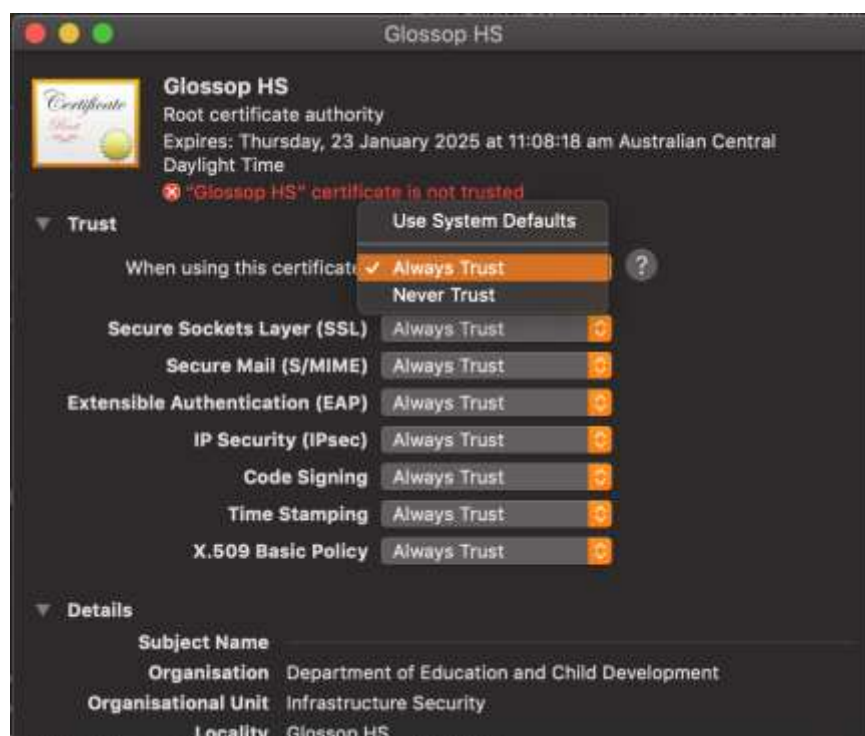

- Now open the Trust drop down menu using the little triangle to the left of "Trust".



- Now click on the box next to "When using this certificate:" to bring up 3 options, you need to select "Always Trust"



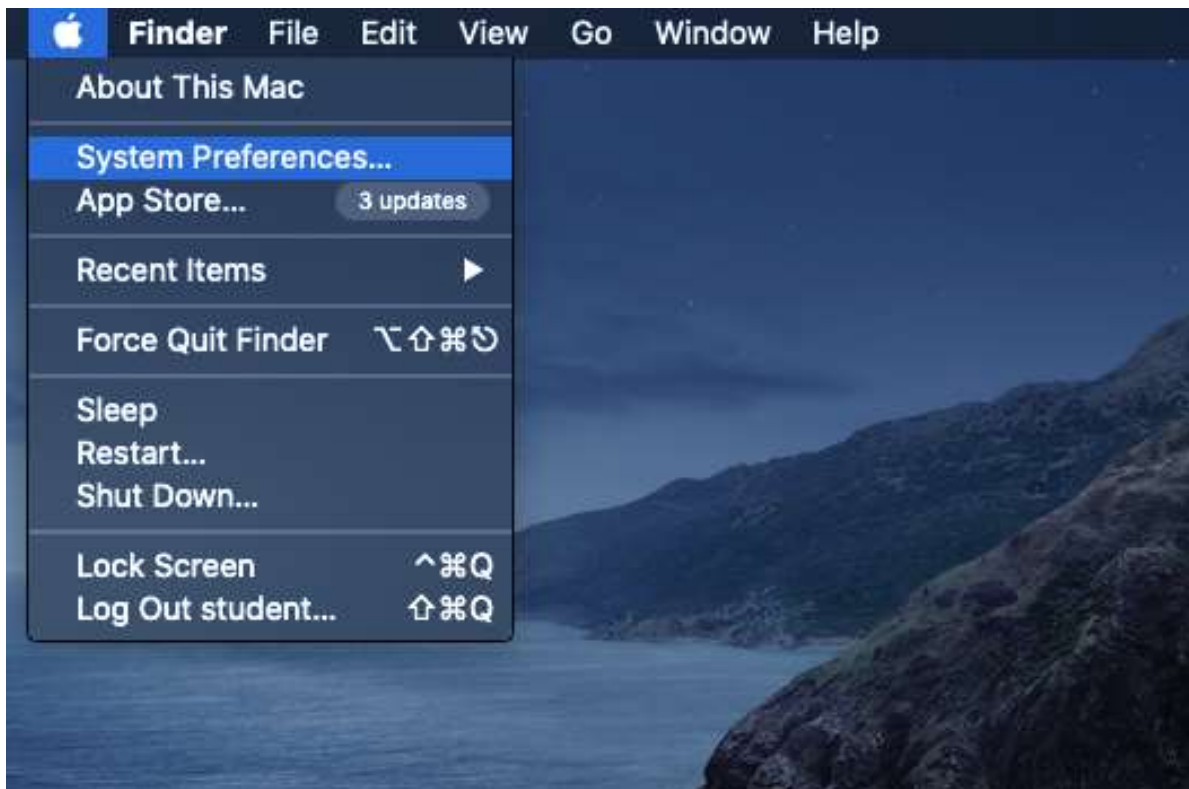
GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- Now you can close the certificate window, it will ask for your computer login each time you do this as its just how apple handles security
- You will have to complete these steps for all the Glossop HS Certificates (Glossop High School, Glossop HS, SAEDU Issuing CA SHA2 and SAEDU Root CA)
- Close keychain access after you have changed the settings for all 4 certificates
- You should now have Internet access

Connecting to Printers at Senior Campus

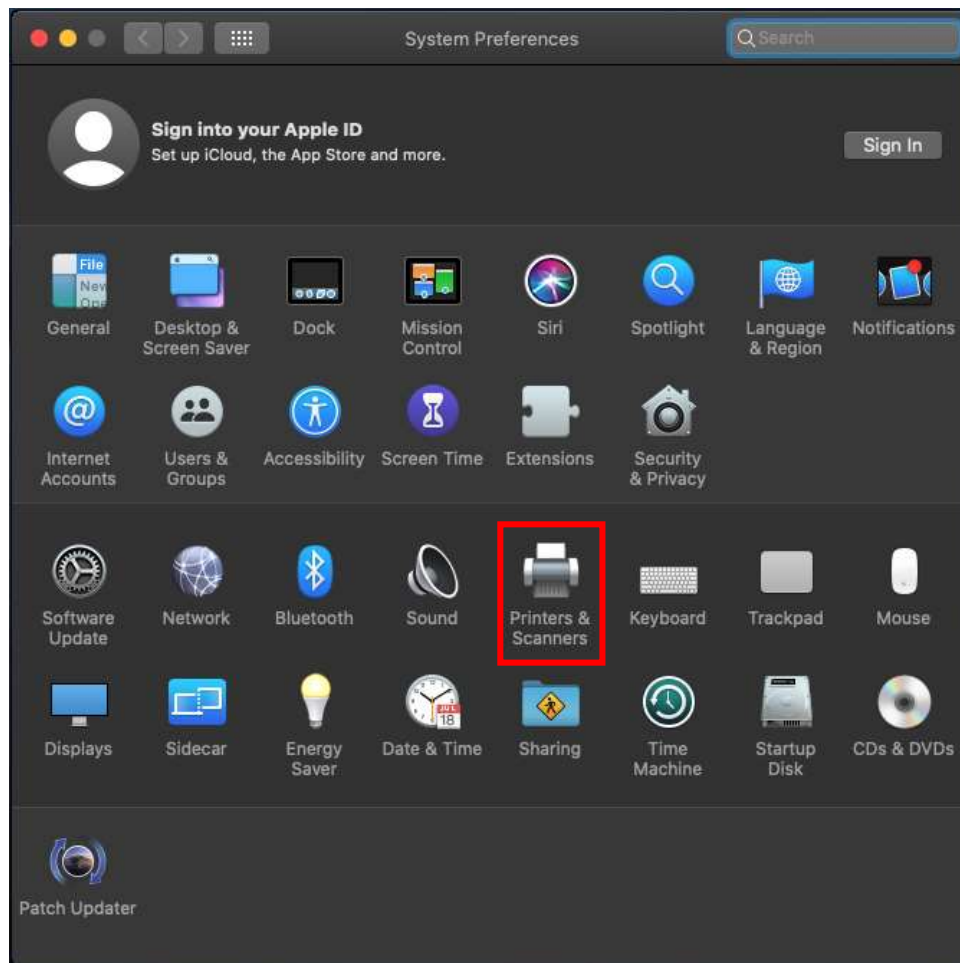
- To connect to printers, you need to click on your desktop so that “finder” is showing up the top left corner of the screen
- Click on the little apple symbol to the left of “Finder”, then open the “System Preferences...” option



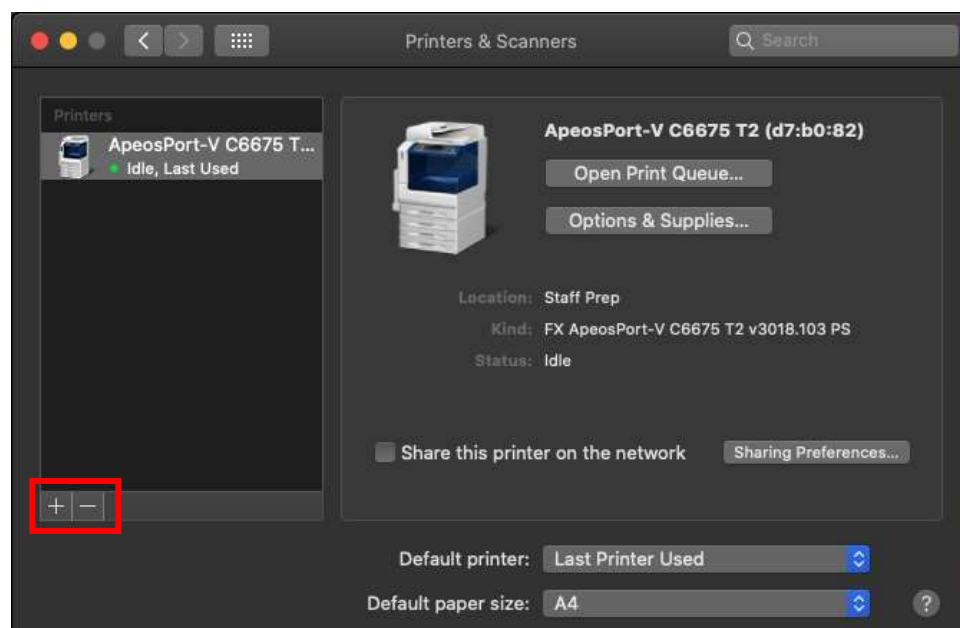

- Once in System preferences, open the “Printers & Scanners” tab



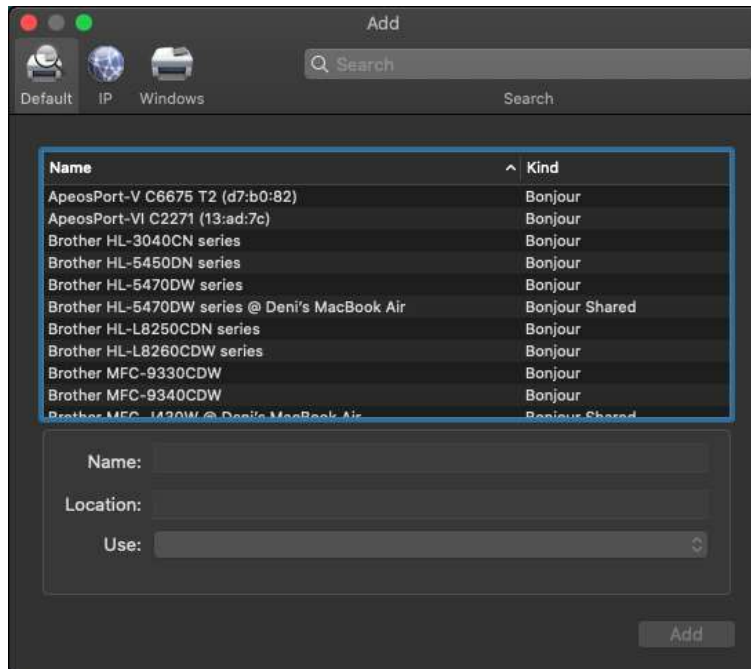
- On the bottom left of the printers box, there will be a little + and – symbol, click on the + symbol to add a printer



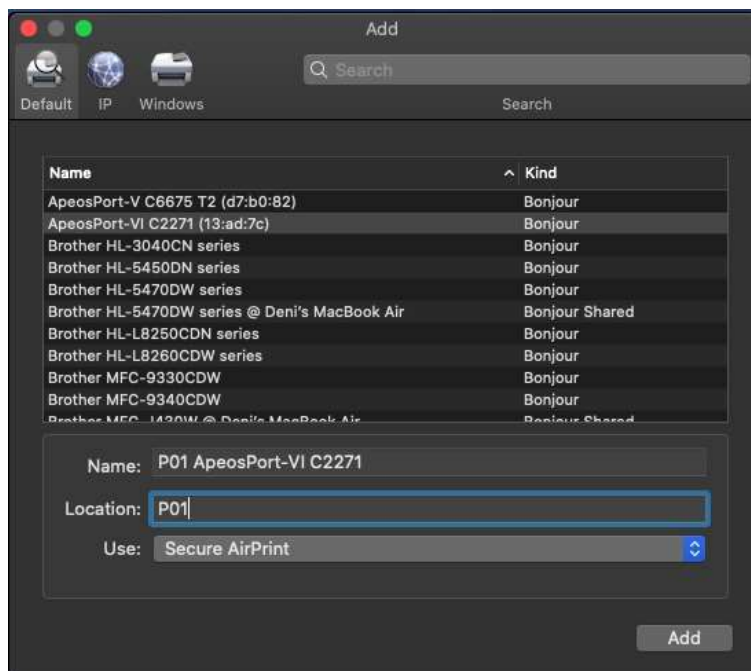
GLOSSOP HIGH SCHOOL



- This will open another window displaying the printers that your machine is picking up on the network



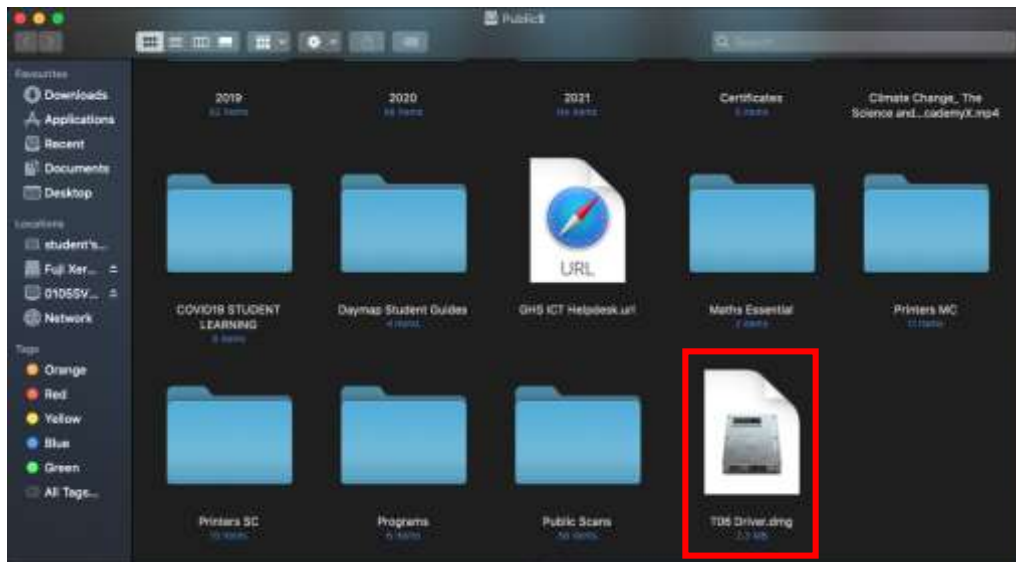
- The first printer you want to add is “ApeosPort-VI C2271 (13:ad:7c)” which is the Photocopier located in P01, to do so, click on the name of the photocopier and then change the name and location of the printer as shown in the photo below then click add



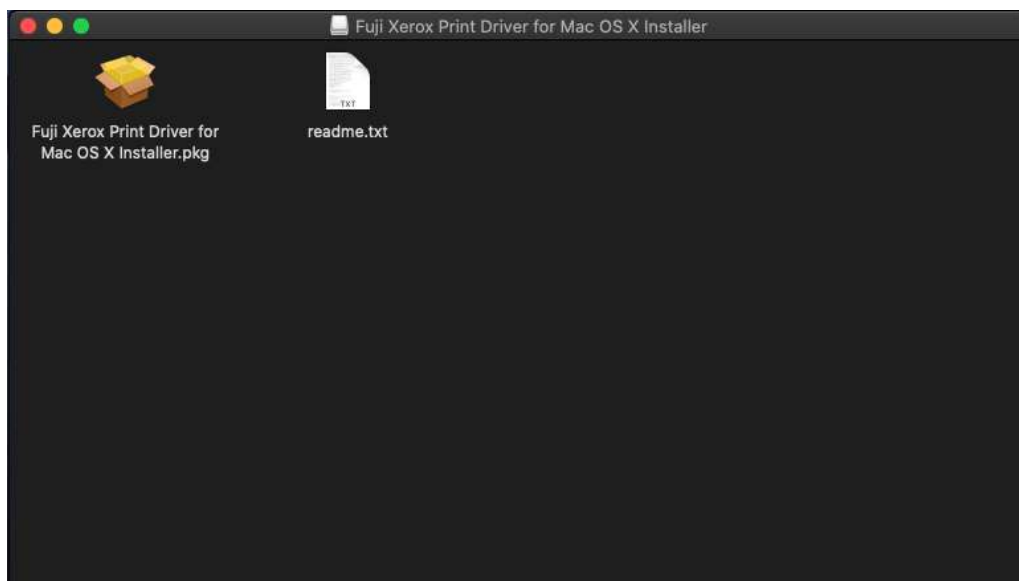

- After adding P01, we can add the photocopier in T06. First you need to install the driver for the photocopier, this is located on the public drive that we set up earlier in this document. Copy the “T06 Driver.dmg” file to your desktop



- Double click this file, a window will open with a install file and a “readme.txt” file, open the “Fuji Xerox Print Driver for Mac OS X Installer.pkg” file

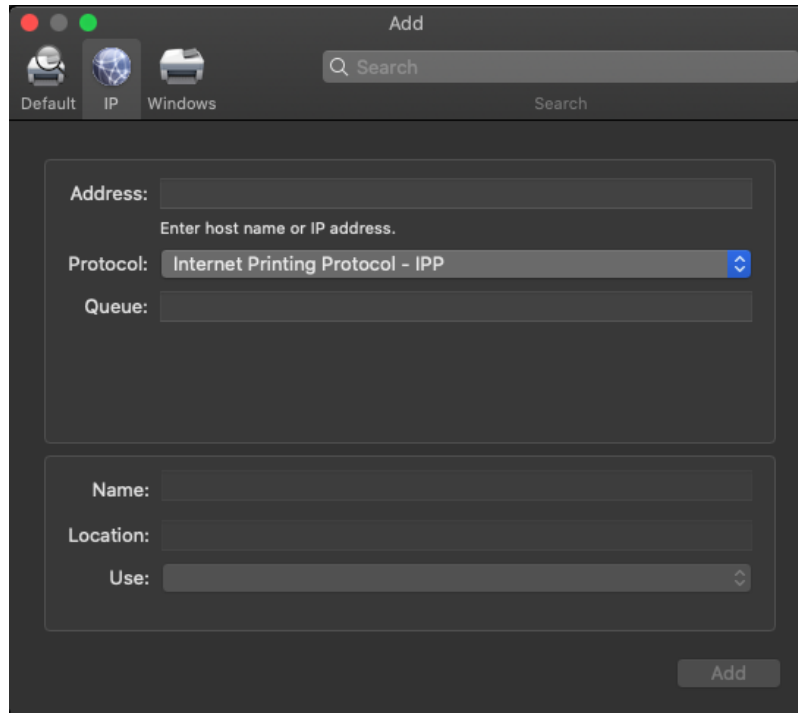


- Now just follow through the install, clicking in order, continue, continue, agree and install, at this point it will ask for your laptop password then click install and finally close.
- You can close these windows and delete the file from your desktop now

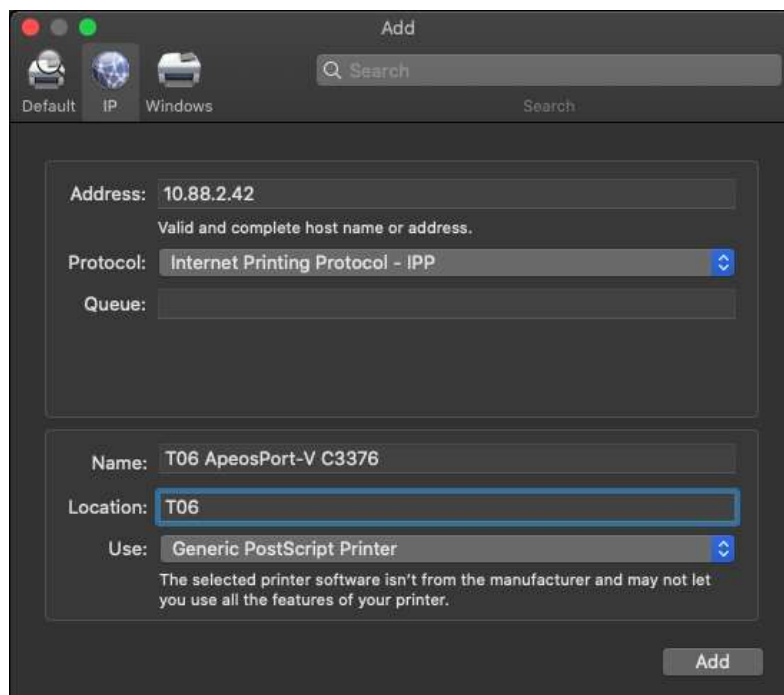

- Once again in the printers window, click the + symbol and open the “IP” tab at the top left of the window



- In the “Address” bar, add the same information as the image below then click the add button, if another window pops up, tick the “Duplex Printing Unit” box and click ok



- You should now have access to printing at Senior Campus Glossop High School
